You can mail lithium battery packs for devices like power banks, laptops, tablets, and cell phones. Always follow safety precautions. Check carrier policies for shipping restrictions and ensure you meet packaging and labeling requirements to avoid any shipping issues. When mailing battery packs.

Where to locate current regulations regarding the mailability of lithium batteries. Domestic Shipments Yes, lithium batteries can be shipped domestically, including Alaska and Hawaii. See the "Lithium Batteries" entry on the Domestic Shipping Prohibitions & Restrictions page for USPS' requirements.

Manufacturers will design and ship these batteries as packs by themselves, pre-installed inside devices, or in the same package as with the device. Whether you are shipping batteries by airplane, ocean vessel, delivery truck, or train, both national and international shipping restrictions must be.

USPS follows federal hazardous materials regulations for transporting batteries. Key requirements include: Lithium-ion batteries must be shipped to prevent short circuits, damage, or accidental device activation. Batteries must be securely packed—usually inside the device or separately, with.

To assist shippers in understanding the requirements related to the transport

of lithium batteries following the regulations, PHMSA/DOT (49 CFR) and IATA have prepared the following publications that refers to regulatory requirements for a specific lithium cell/battery type, configuration, and/or.
