Solar photovoltaic (PV) power has already attained prominence, with installed capacity in 2030 expected to reach between 500 megawatts (MW) and 1,000 MW, depending on the scenario. The roadmap also indicates that deployment of renewables could greatly reduce energy import dependence while lowering the cost of electricity generation in Cyprus.

With its abundant sunlight and a supportive policy environment, Cyprus is well-positioned to become a regional leader in solar energy generation. By

In July 2023, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Cyprus announced a study for a bicomunal solar power plant in Cyprus, with funding from the EU. Managed by the UNDP and supported by the EU, the study aims to enhance cooperation between the island's communities and align with the European Green Deal.
