To calculate the battery capacity for your inverter use this formula  $\text{Inverter capacity (W)} \times \text{Runtime (hrs)} / \text{solar system voltage} = \text{Battery Size} \times 1.15$  Multiply the result by 2 for lead-acid type battery, for lithium battery type it would stay the same Example Let's suppose you have a 3000-watt inverter.
