We expect 63 gigawatts (GW) of new utility-scale electric-generating capacity to be added to the U.S. power grid in 2025 in our latest Preliminary Monthly Electric Generator Inventory report. This amount represents an almost 30% increase from 2024 when 48.6 GW of capacity was installed, the largest.

According to EIA's latest Preliminary Monthly Electric Generator Inventory report, the U.S. power grid is expected to add 63 gigawatts (GW) of new utility-scale electric-generating capacity in 2025. Most of this growth will come from solar power and energy storage, showing strong momentum for clean.

BESS deployment data for 2024 and forecasts for 2025 have been released by BloombergNEF and the Energy Information Administration (EIA) respectively. The US added a record 49GW of new solar capacity in 2024, as renewable power contributed to more than 1,000TWh of the country's total electricity.

The US solar industry installed 7.5 gigawatts direct current (GW dc) of capacity in Q2 2025, a 24% decline from Q2 2024 and a 28% decrease since Q1 2025. Solar accounted for 56% of all new electricity-generating capacity added to the US grid in the first half of 2025, with a total of 18 GW.
